REMARKS

GOOD MORNING, SENATOR BAKER...SENATOR

TARTAGLIONE AND MEMBERS OF THE SENATE LABOR

AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE.

MY NAME IS ABE AMOROS AND I AM THE
PENNSYLVANIA LEGISLATIVE DIRECTOR FOR THE
LABORERS' INTERNATIONAL UNION OF NORTH
AMERICA...ALSO KNOWN AS LIUNA.

ON BEHALF OF MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE
THOUSAND MEMBERS IN PENNSYLVANIA, I BRING YOU
GREETINGS.

AS MANY OF YOU KNOW, LIUNA IS A PRIVATE,
BUSINESS-FRIENDLY UNION THAT HAS A DEMONSTRATED
AND SUCCESSFUL TRACK RECORD WITH CONTRACTORS
THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH OF
PENNSYLVANIA.

LIUNA PROVIDES THE VERY BEST IN TERMS OF SKILLED CRAFTSMANSHIP ON CONSTRUCTION AND HEAVY HIGHWAY PROJECTS.

OUR MEMBERS ARE HIGHLY-TRAINED WORKERS
WHO GET THE JOB DONE...ON TIME...SAFELY – WITH
SOME OF THE BEST TRAINING PROGRAMS IN THE
COUNTRY.

TODAY, I AM URGING MEMBERS OF THIS

COMMITTEE TO PROVIDE RELIEF FOR THOUSANDS OF

CONSTRUCTION WORKERS WHO HAVE BEEN

NEGATIVELY IMPACTED BY ACT 60 OF 2012 WHICH HAVE BEEN COMMONLY REFERRED TO UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES.

AS YOU KNOW, THE BASE YEAR WAGE
REQUIREMENT WAS CHANGED TO FORTY-NINE-AND-A-HALF-PERCENT.

THIS HAS PROVIDED A SIGNIFICANT HARDSHIP FOR OUR MEMBERS WHO HAVE STRUGGLED TO MAKE ENDS MEET.

UNDER THE OLD LAW, A CLAIMANT HAD TO HAVE
TWENTY PERCENT OF HIS OR HER TOTAL WAGES
OUTSIDET OF THE HIGHEST QUARTER IN THE BASE YEAR.

BEFORE ACT 60, THE RATE CAME TO THIRTY SEVEN PERCENT.

ACT 60 ALSO CHANGED THE DEFINITION OF CREDIT WEEK WHICH WAS DEFINED AS A WEEK WHERE THE CLAIMANT EARNED AT LEAST FIFTY DOLLARS OR MORE PRIOR TO ITS ENACTMENT...TODAY, CREDIT WEEK IS DEFINED AS A WEEK WHERE ONE MUST EARN AT LEAST \$100.

SINCE A CLAIMANT MUST HAVE EIGHTEEN CREDIT
WEEKS IN A BASE YEAR TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR BENEFITS,
THIS CHANGE IN DEFINITION MAKES IT MORE DIFFICULT
FOR WORKERS WHO EARN LESS PER WEEK OR WORKING
PART TIME TO COLLECT.

UNDER THE PREVIOUS LAW, A MINIMUM WEEKLY

BENEFIT – OR WBR – WAS THIRTY FIVE DOLLARS PER

WEEK.

UNDER ACT 60, IT DOUBLES TO SEVENTY DOLLARS WEEKLY. THIS MEANS THAT A CLAIMAINT MUST HAVE EARNED AT LEAST \$3,931 DURING THE PAST YEAR, COMPARED TO \$1,320 UNDER THE PREVIOUS ACT, TO POTENTIALLY QUALIFY.

A CONSTRUCTION WORKER MUST NOW HAVE A
MINIMUM OF 18 CREDIT WEEKS...AS OPPOSED TO

16...MAKING IT MORE DIFFICULT TO OBTAIN BENEFITS.

UNDER THE OLD LAW, A CLAIMANTS PARTIAL

BENEFIT CREDIT – WHICH IS THE PORTION OF THE WBR

THAT HE OR SHE COULD EARN BEFORE BEING

PENALIZED BY HAVING THE UNEMPLOYMENT

COMPENSATION REDUCED WAS FORTHY PERCENT OF THE WBR.

TODAY, THAT PARTIAL BENEFIT CREDIT NOW EQUALS THIRTY PERCENT OF THE CLAIMAN'S WBR.

AS A RESULT, CLAIMANTS WHO FIND PART TIME
WORK WILL HAVE THEIR WBR REDUCED SOONER AS A
RESULT OF PART-TIME EARNINGS.

THAT MEANS A CLAIMANT COLLECTING UC MAY
ONLY EARN UP TO THIRTY PERCENT OF HIS OR HER WBR
IN PART-TIME WORK BEFORE SUCH EARNINGS ARE
OFFSET AGAINST UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS.

THERE ARE OTHER EXAMPLES OF SHORTCOMINGS
WITH THE NEW LAW, BUT THESE WERE THE ONES OF
MOST IMPORTANCE TO OUR MEMBERS.

SENATORS: THIS PAIN IS REAL. DUE TO CHANGES IN THE LAW, OUR MEMBERS HAVE MISSED MORTGAGE PAYMENTS, CAR PAYMENTS AND HAVE HAD TO CUT BACK ON DAILY LIVING EXPENSES.

NOTHING IS MORE FRIGHTENING TO A WORKING FAMILY THAN NOT KNOWING WHERE THEIR NEXT SOURCE OF INCOME WILL BE.

FOR WORKERS WITH SMALL CHILDREN, ELDERLY ADULTS OR THOSE CARING FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS, THE FEAR IS EVEN GREATER.

WHAT WE ARE ASKING FOR IS A SOLUTION THAT WILL ALLOW THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN NEGATIVELY IMPACTED TO SEEK RELIEF.

OUR CONSTRUCTION WORKERS ARE WELL AWARE
OF THE FACT THAT THEY PROBABLY NOT BE WORKING
YEAR ROUND...HOWEVER, IT DOESN'T DIMINISH THE
STELLAR JOBS THAT THEY PERFORM IN SWELTERING
HEAT, HIGH WINDS AND SOMETIMES TREACHEROUS
CONDITIONS.

IF THESE WERE INDEED UNINTENDED

CONSEQUENCES, WE ASK MEMBERS OF THIS COMMITTEE

AND BOTH CHAMBERS TO CAREFULLY REVIEW THE

HARM THAT IT HAS PRODUCED...REMEDY THE

SITUATION...AND ENACT A SOLUTION AS QUICKLY AS

POSSIBLE.

WITH SEVERAL MONTHS LEFT IN THE

CONSTRUCTION SEASON LEFT, NOW IS THE TIME TO PUT

FORTH A SOLUTION THAT WILL NOT ONLY PROVIDE

PEACE OF MIND FOR THOUSANDS OF WORKERS...BUT

DEMONSTRATE TO THEM...AND THEIR FAMILIES...HOW
MUCH YOU APPRECIATE THEIR EFFORTS IN FIXING OUR
ROADS, RECONSTRUCTING OUR BRIDGES AND MAKING
OUR INFRASTRUCTURE SAFTER IN PENNSYLVANIA.
